Now in its 27th season, Chicago's Farmers Markets are a summer fixture in the city. This year, there are 24 locations citywide, including four downtown.

One of the largest and most popular Markets is at Daley Plaza on most Thursdays this summer. Through October, you can buy farm fresh fruits, veggies, plants, and flowers direct from dozens of growers and produce purveyors without a trek to the country. In conjunction with October festivities on the Plaza, there will be daily weekday markets during the latter half of that month.

The Mayor wants the Daley Center to take the LEED

Just how environmentally good, or "green," can a high-rise building be? Mayor Daley wants to find out, and he is challenging the Daley Center to become LEED certified.

LEED, which stands for Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design, is an environmental standard developed by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) in 2000 to rate and qualify a building's environmental friendliness. USGBC is a national, non-profit organization founded in 1993 with a mission to integrate, lead, and educate people in green building.

Assistant General Manager Andy Siegel, who is spearheading the effort on behalf of the PBC at the Daley Center, explains, "Becoming certified is a complex process with ratings in half a dozen categories and careful documentation."
